This hymn resembles many 18th-century drawings that show parallels between worship on earth and worship in heaven, especially as described in Revelation 7:9-11. This 18th-century tune has had many names, including "The Church" and "The Church of the Lamb." It was first published in the hymn book *Church Hymns*, 1714-1901.
